The past few months have been exceptionally busy for the Science Department, filled with notable achievements and exciting events. We are thrilled to announce outstanding Leaving Certificate results, a testament to the dedication and hard work of our students and teachers and wish all our students the best in their future endeavours.

In celebration of Space Week and Science Week, our Science Department has been actively involved in various events. Four of our projects have been accepted to the prestigious BT Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition in January, showcasing the innovation and talent within our department.



During Space Week, Ms. Knightly's 3rd-year students engaged in a thrilling table quiz, and we extend our heartfelt congratulations to Sabit, Mark, and Luca for their great performance

Our 2nd-year students had a fantastic Science Week, attending a captivating talk titled 'The Universe Talk' at Siamsa Tíre, presented by the esteemed David Moore. Ms. O'Keefe also led students in solving daily riddles, fostering a love for scientific problem-solving. The week culminated with our Senior Science Team trained by Ms. Knightly emerging victorious in the Senior Science Quiz, with team members Karim Abusamra, Samuel Regan, and Tom Stuart securing 1st place.

In early December, our Senior Science Team represented our school and county at the ISTA National Senior Science Quiz held at TCD. The team's exceptional performance earned them the 9th highest score in a fiercely competitive field of 43 teams. Congratulations to our team for their dedication and achievement and also to their teacher Ms.Knightly.





BT Young Scientist & Technology Exhibition

Out of a staggering 2,040 entries, only 550 projects have been shortlisted by the judges, and our students have clinched their spots! Second-year wonders Eanna Thibeaud, Joseph O'Connor, and James Doody have secured their positions in the Biological and Ecological Sciences category. They are carrying out an exciting research



project on enhancing soil health and crop growth through natural soil enhancers. They are looking at waste products from industry that can be used as natural fertilisers, all part of the circular bioeconomy. They have greatly benefitted from the expertise of John de Brún lasc Teo Dingle, Kerry Ingredients Listowel and Shannon ABC, MTU.

Ethan Ward, Donncha Enright, Jaidon Ward Barrett, Tomasz Bober and Rian Curtin from Transition Year are heading to BTYSE 2024 with their impressive Technology projects.

Ethan Ward and Donncha Enright are carrying out research into how an AI platform they have developed can aid in differentiating learning in a mixed ability classroom.

Jaidon Ward Barrett, Tomasz Bober and Rian Curtin have built a mobility and care assistant. Both these teams have learned from REEdI, MTU. Rae Moriarty from Transition Year is set to shine in the Social and Behavioural Scientist Category having undertaken a project on transforming sustainability education in the Irish education system. Rae has benefitted from interview with geologist members of Conservation Fenit.

These students are being mentored by Ms. Eilín Enright, Ms. Máire Fitzgerald, Ms. Julianne O' Keeffe and Ms. Ellen McGillycuddy and supported by all the school community in the lead up to the event.

CPR 4 Schools Training

Debating



Our website underwent a redesign and was relaunched in the autumn term. It now provides the latest information on school policies, curricular, and extracurricular activities.



Future Initiatives for the Digital Infrastructure of our School include

- Implementation of an enhanced Wi-Fi system across the entire school
- Installation of new digital noticeboards by the upcoming Christmas season
- Scheduled upgrades for all computers in the computer room in the year 2024
- Collaboration with technology companies to explore options for refurbished devices that can be integrated into the school environment to enhance student learning.

Use of digital technology in respect of teaching, learning and assessment

- All staff and students have Microsoft 365 accounts which has enhanced both teacher and student collective and collaborative practice.
- Many teachers use online assessment and virtual learning environments as part of their teaching and learning (OneNote, Teams, Flipgrid, Quizlet, Kahoot, Padlet, StudyClix and others)
- All exam results and class tests are recorded on Athena, which is our academic monitoring tool, which highlights when a student falls below his potential and may need further support. In recent months our 3rd, 5th and 6th year students now have student accounts to encourage them to set their own targets and reflect on their learning, thus empowering them to take more responsibility for their school work.
- Our school has created a bespoke Junior Cycle short course 'Learning to Learn' which supports students use of technology across the curriculum.
- All Transition years students complete the Microsoft Office
 Specialist training programme as part of the TY curriculum since
 September 2023. This course distinguishes our students as truly
 knowledgeable in using the suite of Microsoft office applications
 and students are awarded a worldwide recognised certificate
 upon successful completion of the course and exams.

Digital Technology Leadership and Policy Development

- All staff are part of digital leadership teams, where they benefit from mentoring by our team of staff digital leaders.
- 10 of our TY students are engaged with the Microsoft
 Dreamspace Ambassador programme and through this
 programme organise various student events to promote STEM
 education at The Green.
